AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE OFFICE OF MUNICIPAL JUDGE, PROVIDING THAT THE MUNICIPAL JUDGE BE APPOINTED BY THE MAYOR WITH THE APPROVAL OF A MAJORITY OF THE ALDERMEN, PROVIDING THAT THE MUNICIPAL JUDGE SHALL BE COMPENSATED IN AN AMOUNT TO BE DETERMINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL, AND PROVIDING THAT THE APPOINTMENT OF THE MUNICIPAL JUDGE MAY BE TERMINATED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL.

and all outside the state of the

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CANEY CITY, TEXAS:

SECTION I.

There is hereby created the office of Municipal Judge of the Town of Caney City, Texas. The Mayor shall no longer act as Municipal Judge. The Mayor, with the consent of the majority of the Aldermen, shall appoint the Municipal Judge, who shall conduct the affairs of the corporation court, having jurisdiction to do all things incidental to the maintenance of a municipal court. The Municipal Judge shall serve at the convenience of and with the approval of the Town Council, who may terminate his appointment at any time. The Municipal Judge shall be compensated as the Town Council shall determine from time to time.

SECTION II.

The fact that the Town of Caney City now has no ordinance governing the matter regulated herein or creating the office of Municipal Judge, and that it is deemed to be in the best interest of the citizens of the Town of Caney City that such an office be created, creates an emergency, which is here and now declared, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication, as provided by law.
